Bruce K. Johnson, is a member of the Professional Staff on the House Committee on Armed Services. During the 114th Congress, he assumed responsibility for oversight of the following program accounts: Air Force airlift (C-5, C-17, C-130 series); air refueling (KC-10, KC-46A, and KC-135); bombers (B-1, B-2, and B-52); VC-25A and VC-25B Presidential Aircraft Recapitalization (PAR); Operational Support Airlift (OSA) and Executive Airlift (EA). Additionally, Bruce is responsible for Navy special mission aircraft to include (EP-3, P-3 series, E-2 series, P-8A, KC-130J, C-130 series, and C-2); and shipborne Unmanned Aerial Vehicles.

Prior to joining the Committee, Bruce served over 27 years as an Air Force officer both in the Regular and Reserve components. His most recent Air Force assignment was Deputy Director, Resource Analysis, HQ USAF Studies, Analyses, and Assessments at the Pentagon. Bruce's prior experience includes multiple Air Staff assignments covering plans and programs, strategy development, and strategic communications. Bruce logged over 3,000 flying hours during his fifteen year operational career in the F-111F and C-130H while participating in operations throughout the United States, Central and South America, Europe, and Southwest Asia.
